IF YOU ARE NEW to COSL, here are some things you might like to know:

- Who we are. COSL is a congregation of the family of God that welcomes all people without discrimination or prejudice, seeking to strengthen one another with Word and Sacraments, prayer and example. Our mission is to:

This ministry is provided in the Nursery School Room, located on the lower level.
- **Sunday School**, available for children ages 4 through 12, is offered September through June. The program begins during the 10AM worship with an opening Children's Message among the entire congregation, and then the students depart to learn beloved Bible stories, Lutheran identity and the love of Jesus. They return before the conclusion of worship to participate in the dismissal. On designated Youth Sundays the students may remain with the entire congregation and participate in a meaningful way throughout the liturgy.
- **Coffee and refreshments** are generally served following worship in the Parlor, located on the lower level accessible from the narthex (entrance hall). Please join us!

BLESSING OF ADVENT WREATH

- Assisting: We praise you, O God, for this victory wreath that marks our days of preparation for Christ's advent. As we light the candles on this wreath, strengthen our hearts as we await the Lord's coming in glory. Enlighten us with your grace, that we may serve our neighbors in need. Grant this through Christ our Lord, whose coming is certain and whose day draws near.
- All: Amen.



LIGHTING OF ADVENT CANDLES

Light the first three candles. The assembly sings the following hymn during the lighting.

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

All may make the sign of the cross, the sign marked at baptism, as the presiding minister begins.

- *Presider:* Blessed be the holy Trinity, + one God, the parent who rouses us from slumber, the shepherd who gathers us on the holy mountain, the deliverer who sets us free.
- All: Amen.
- *Presider:* Let us come before the living God in confession.

Silence is kept for reflection.

- Presider: As we wait and watch for the promised day of salvation,
 All: we open our hearts to you, O God. Search us and know us. Reveal all that we keep inside. To you, O God, we confess our sins, known and unknown. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us in your ways of justice and peace. Make us reflections of the radiant love of your beloved Son, Jesus Christ. Amen.
- All: Amen.

CHRISTMAS PAGEANT

- Narrator 1: One early morning, Mary woke to knocking on her door. She ran to see a visitor she'd never seen before. An angel dressed in robes of white was at her side. "Don't be afraid" the angel said, when Mary tried to hide.
- Narrator 2: "God says that you will have a child: The Son of God above! He'll be the King of all the world and rule in peace and love." Then Mary smiled and bowed her head. She dreamed about her son. "I am God's servant," Mary said. "So, let God's will be done."

CHRISTMAS CAROL: Mary Did You Know (On Screen)

- *Narrator 3:* Now Caesar Augustus had sent a decree, that a census was ordered for all people, you see? So, to Bethlehem young Mary and Joseph must go, A long and tough journey, moving steady and slow.
- Narrator 4: It had been a long day for both Joseph and Mary. It had been a big load for a donkey to carry. And poor Joseph wondered along the whole way, "When we finally get there, where will we stay?"
- Narrator 1: The Bethlehem crowds filled the couple with fear, and the innkeeper said, "there's no room for you here!" Joseph thought and he thought and looked all over town, "There must be a place for my wife to lie down."
- Narrator 2: Then he spotted a stall filled with chickens and sheep, "In that place," Joseph thought "even donkeys can sleep!" So, this little stable, hidden out of the way, would very soon be the place where the new baby lay.
- Narrator 3: The Earth is rejoicing, down below and above as angels shout their praises and love. "Glory to God in the highest" they sing, "Christ is born, the heavenly King!"

- *Narrator 4:* So, our new, little family settled down in the hay, no crib for the babe, so in a manger he lay. Closing their eyes, in the early twilight, they are soon sleeping peacefully, on this silent night.
- Narrator 1: Now while the shepherds were tending their flock through the night, what came before them was such a heavenly sight. The angel announced there was nothing to fear, that they should rejoice, for the savior is here!

- Narrator 2: The news had spread far, and the news had spread wide, The Savior was here, it could not be denied. All kinds came to see him, giving gifts to the lad, though not having much, they gave all that they had.
- *Narrator 3:* Kings of all places had heard of the child, many rejoiced, though some reviled. King Herod especially found the news grim and was afraid this new baby was worth more than him.
- *Narrator 4:* He arranged for three men to go on ahead, to praise the new baby, but they were misled. For Herod's intentions were anything but warm, He wished to do the little one harm.

Presider: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Presider: It is indeed right, our duty and our joy, that we should at all times and in all places give thanks and praise to you, almighty and merciful God, through our Savior Jesus Christ. You comforted your people with the promise of the Redeemer, through whom you will also make all things new in the day when he comes to judge the world in righteousness. And so, with all the choirs of angels, with the church on earth and the hosts of heaven, we praise your name and join their unending hymn:



THANKSGIVING AT THE TABLE

- *Presider:* In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.
- *Presider:* Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

LORD'S PRAYER

Presider: Lord, remember us in your kingdom, and teach us to pray: All: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.

Presider: Come now with joy to Emmanuel's table. Feast at the banquet of hope and love.



The assembly is seated. The bread may be broken for the communion.



COMMUNION

We welcome all baptized believers, regardless of faith tradition, to celebrate Holy Communion at the Lord's Table. Ushers will help guide all for the distribution of Holy Communion. Unless instructed otherwise, worshipers will approach the altar from the center aisle and, if able, kneel at the Altar Rail. The presiding minister will distribute the consecrated bread, or hosts. Assisting ministers will offer individual cups of consecrated red wine and white grape juice. Should anyone have dietary concerns, gluten-free consecrated hosts are readily available upon request to the presiding minister. If you do not wish to receive Holy Communion, you are still invited to come to the Lord's Table to receive a blessing; kindly cross your arms as a method to advise the presiding minister of your desire to be blessed. When giving the bread and cup, the communion ministers say, "The body of Christ, given for you," and "The blood of Christ, shed for you," and each person may respond "Amen." Following receipt of Holy Communion, the acolyte will collect the empty cups, and the communed worshipers are invited to return to their places via the side aisles.
