INTRODUCTION

Every year, there are some among us who, for one reason or another, simply cannot enter into the joy of the Christmas season. It could be many things: mourning someone who has died or who may die soon, coping with the aftermath of divorce, job loss, sickness — any of the different unfortunate and tragic circumstances the life sometimes serves up. Christmas parties and caroling are the last things some of us want.

The Blue Christmas Service (or sometimes called The Longest Night Service) is a way to acknowledge this reality, while still recognizing that part of the reason for Jesus' coming was to bring hope and comfort, to heal the sick, to seek the lost, to restore the broken and broken-hearted.

GATHERING - The Holy Spirit calls us together as the people of God.

The assembly stands.

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

All may make the sign of the cross, the sign marked at baptism, as the presiding minister begins.

Presider: We gather in the name of the Father, and of the
→ Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

All: Amen.

Presider: In this season of our longest nights, let us bring to God the pain in our hearts, as we confess our faults and failings.

Silence is kept for reflection.

- Presider: Merciful Father,
- All: we confess the way we feel now. Our hearts feel heavy within us; we are weighed down with the loss of loved ones, the loss of opportunities, the shifting of hopes and dreams. As many people celebrate Jesus' birth, it's hard for us to lift up our hearts. As many celebrate and sing with joy, we often find the days seem gray and our tongues cannot rejoice. Help us. Embrace us. Heal us. You, who know the grief of the world, meet each of us in our aching hearts. Hold us close until the days dawn a bit brighter and we find we can walk in delight once more.
- All: Amen.

- Lector: ¹⁵One of the dinner guests, on hearing this, said to him, "Blessed is anyone who will eat bread in the kingdom of God!" ¹⁶Then Jesus said to him, "Someone gave a great dinner and invited many. ¹⁷At the time for the dinner he sent his slave to say to those who had been invited, 'Come; for everything is ready now.' ¹⁸But they all alike began to make excuses. The first said to him, 'I have bought a piece of land, and I must go out and see it; please accept my regrets.' ¹⁹Another said, 'I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I am going to try them out; please accept my regrets.' ²⁰Another said, 'I have just been married, and therefore I cannot come.' ²¹So the slave returned and reported this to his master. - *Lector:* ¹⁷He came down with them and stood on a level place, with a great crowd of his disciples and a great multitude of people from all Judea, Jerusalem, and the coast of Tyre and Sidon. ¹⁸They had come to hear him and to be healed of their diseases; and those who were troubled with unclean spirits were cured. ¹⁹And all in the crowd were trying to touch him, for power came out from him and healed all of them.

²⁰Then he looked up at his disciples and said: "Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God. ²¹"Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you will be filled. "Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh. ²²"Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the Son of Man. ²³Rejoice in that day and leap for joy, for surely your reward is great in heaven; for that is what their ancestors did to the prophets.

- Lector: ¹"Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. ²And I saw the holy city, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. ³And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "See, the home of God is among mortals. He will dwell with them as their God; they will be his peoples, and God himself will be with them; ⁴he will wipe every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more; mourning and crying and pain will be no more, for the first things have passed away." 5And the one who was seated on the throne said, "See, I am making all things new." Also he said, "Write this, for these words are trustworthy and true." 6Then he said to me, "It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. CREED

Presider: Let us confess our faith in the words of the Apostles' Creed:All: I believe in God, the Father almighty,creator of heaven and earth.

All: I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

All: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

HEALING

Presider: Our Lord Jesus healed many as a sign of the reign of God come near and sent the disciples to continue this work of healing—with prayer, the laying on of hands, and anointing. In the name of Christ, the great healer and reconciler of the world, we now entrust to God all who need healing.

PRAYERS OF INTERCESSION

Assistant: Let us pray for the whole people of God in Christ Jesus, and especially for all who are suffering or are in any affliction.

A brief silence.

Assistant: We pray for all who hurt in their bodies ... for all the aches and pains and weakness and discomfort and sleepless nights. To them, Lord draw near.

All: Draw near and stay.

- Assistant: We pray for all who hurt in their hearts ... for the fear, for the sorrow, for the disappointment, for the disillusionment. To them, Lord draw near.All: Draw near and stay.
- Assistant: We pray for all who grieve ... who feel empty, who live with loneliness and discouragement and rejection. To them, Lord draw near.

All: Draw near and stay.

Assistant: We pray for all who experience violence ... for the bullied and the persecuted, for those betrayed and sold out, for those bruised and afraid to be bruised. To them, Lord draw near.

All: Draw near and stay.

- Assistant: We pray for caregivers ... for brave people who try, who don't know what to say or what to do, but they show up. Bless them, for it has to hurt them to see our hurt. Strengthen the knees of those who pray and those who kneel to wash and kiss and hold. To them, Lord draw near.
 All: Draw near and stay.
- Assistant: We pray for those who are with us today ... we pray, knowing we are not alone, knowing there are others, beginning to realize this is more normal than what we thought was normal. To us, Lord draw near.
 All: Draw near and stay.

The presiding minister concludes the prayers.

- *Presider:* O God, we bring these intercessions before you, knowing that you will hear us as you have promised, and will answer according to the mercy shown in Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.
- All: Amen.
- Choir: ♪ Amen. Amen. ♪

LIGHTING OF CANDLES, LAYING OF HANDS AND ANOINTING

Presider: Sisters and brothers, I invite you to come and receive a sign of healing and wholeness in the name of the triune God. You are invited to come forward to light a candle for yourself or a loved one. If you choose, you may also come forward for laying of hands and anointing. Those who remain in their seats are invited to pray for those who have gone forward for healing.




The assembly is seated.

Those who wish to receive laying on of hands and anointing approach and, if able, they may kneel. The minister lays both hands on each person's head and anoint the person's forehead with oil, making the sign of the cross. The following or similar words may be spoken:

Presider: In the name of our Savior Jesus Christ, be strengthened and filled with God's grace, that you may know the healing power of the Spirit. You are anointed in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.

The laying on of hands and anointing is accompanied by singing a taizé hymn, a short song repeated again and again, to create a meditative character. Using just a few words they express a basic reality of faith, quickly grasped by the mind. As the words are sung over many times, this reality gradually penetrates the whole being. Meditative singing thus becomes a way of listening to God. It allows everyone to take part in a time of prayer together and to remain together in attentive waiting on God.





Following the laying of hands and anointing <u>the assembly stands</u>, and the presiding minister continues.

Presider: Let us pray.

Living God, through the laying on of hands and anointing, grant comfort in suffering to all who are in need of healing. When they are afraid, give them courage; when afflicted, give them patience; when dejected, give them hope; and when alone, assure them of the support of your holy people. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.



PEACE

Presider: The peace of Christ be with you always.

All: And also with you.

The people may greet one another with a sign of Christ's peace, and may say, "Peace be with you," or similar words.

The assembly is seated.

MEAL - God feeds us with the presence of Jesus Christ.


OFFERING

DIALOGUE


- *Presider:* The Lord be with you.

LORD'S PRAYER


Presider: Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us. *All:* **Our Father, who art in heaven,**

COMMUNION

We welcome all baptized believers, regardless of faith tradition, to celebrate Holy Communion at the Lord's Table. Ushers will help guide all for the distribution of Holy Communion. Unless instructed otherwise, worshipers will approach the altar from the center aisle and, if able, kneel at the Altar Rail. The presiding minister will distribute the consecrated bread, or hosts. Assisting ministers will offer individual cups of consecrated red wine and white grape juice. Should anyone have dietary concerns, gluten-free consecrated hosts are readily available upon request to the presiding minister. If you do not wish to receive Holy Communion, you are still invited to come to the Lord's Table to receive a blessing; kindly cross your arms as a method to advise the presiding minister of your desire to be blessed. When giving the bread and cup, the communion ministers say, "The body of Christ, given for you," and "The blood of Christ, shed for you," and each person may respond "Amen." Following receipt of Holy Communion, the acolyte will collect the empty cups, and the communed worshipers are invited to return to their places via the side aisles.


