IF YOU ARE NEW to COSL, here are some things you might like to know:

- Who we are. COSL is a congregation of the family of God that welcomes all people without discrimination or prejudice, seeking to strengthen one another with Word and Sacraments, prayer and example. Our mission is to:

The program begins during the 10AM worship with an opening Children's Message among the entire congregation, and then the students depart to learn beloved Bible stories, Lutheran identity and the love of Jesus. They return before the conclusion of worship to participate in the dismissal. On designated Youth Sundays the students may remain with the entire congregation and participate in a meaningful way throughout the liturgy.

INTRODUCTION

On Christmas morning the people of God gather to celebrate the birth of the Word made flesh, Christ our Lord. Luke recounts the familiar story of shepherds and angels. The meaning of Christmas is made clear: the light shines in the darkness. It is in the liturgy that we encounter the Word made flesh—in the people of God gathered together as the body of Christ, and in the meal around the holy table. We go forth to be bearers of light as we proclaim this good news to all the ends of the earth.

PRELUDE: Christmas Favorites

GATHERING - The Holy Spirit calls us together as the people of God.

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

All may make the sign of the cross, the sign marked at baptism, as the presiding minister begins.

Presider: Blessed be the Holy One of Israel, the Word made flesh, the Power of

the Most High, + one God, now and forever.

All: Amen.

Presider: Gathered in the name of Jesus, let us confess our sin against God and

our neighbor.

Silence is kept for reflection.

Presider: Gracious God,

All: in Christ Jesus you come among us as light shining in darkness.

We confess our failure to welcome this light. Forgive us and

renew our hope, so that we may live in the light of your grace, and

welcome the truth of Christ the Lord.

Amen.

Presider: I bring you good news of great joy for all the people: To you is born a

GREETING

Presider: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the

WORD - God speaks to us in scripture reading, preaching, and song.



FIRST READING: Isaiah 62:6-12

The prophet invites the people to give God no rest until God reestablishes Jerusalem. In turn, they will receive names full of promise: Holy People, the Redeemed of the Lord, a City Not Forsaken.

Lector: A reading from the Prophet Isaiah:

Lector: ⁶Upon your walls, O Jerusalem,

I have posted sentinels;

all day and all night

they shall never be silent.

You who remind the Lord, take no rest. ⁷and give him no rest until he establishes Jerusalem and makes it renowned throughout the earth. 8The Lord has sworn by his right hand

and by his mighty arm:

I will not again give your grain to be food for your enemies, and foreigners shall not drink the wine for which you have labored;

⁹but those who garner it shall eat it and praise the Lord,

and those who gather it shall drink it in my holy courts.

¹⁰Go through, go through the gates, prepare the way for the people; build up, build up the highway,

clear it of stones,

lift up an ensign over the peoples.

¹¹The Lord has proclaimed to the end of the earth:

Say to daughter Zion,

"See, your salvation comes;

his reward is with him.

and his recompense before him."

¹²They shall be called, "The Holy People,

The Redeemed of the Lord":

and you shall be called, "Sought Out, A City Not Forsaken."

Assistant: ³Fire goes before the Lord,

burning up enemies on every side.

All: 4Lightnings light up the world;

the earth sees and trembles.

Assistant: 5The mountains melt like wax

before the Lord of all the earth.

All: 6The heavens declare your righteousness, O Lord,

and all the peoples see your glory.

Assistant: ⁷Confounded be all who worship carved images

and delight in false gods!

Bow down before the Lord, all you gods.

All: 8Zion hears and is glad, and the cities of Judah rejoice,

because of your judgments, O Lord.

Assistant: 9For you are the Lord, most high over all the earth;

you are exalted far above all gods.

All: 10You who love the Lord, hate evil!

God guards the lives of the saints

and rescues them from the hand of the wicked.


Assistant: 11Light dawns for the righteous,

and joy for the honest of heart.

All: 12Rejoice in the Lord, you righteous,

and give thanks to God's holy name.

GOSPEL: Luke 2:8-20

The world's deep night is shattered by the light of God's new day. The glory of God is revealed to poor shepherds, who share the good news with others.

Presider: The holy gospel according to Saint Luke:

All: Glory to you, O Lord.

Presider:

⁸In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. ⁹Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. ¹⁰But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: ¹¹to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. ¹²This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." ¹³And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying,

¹⁴"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!"

¹⁵When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." ¹⁶So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. ¹⁷When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; ¹⁸and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. ¹⁹But Mary treasured all these words

and pondered them in her heart. ²⁰The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

Presider: The gospel of the Lord.

All: Praise to you, O Christ.

The assembly is seated.

All: hear our prayer.

Assistant: Holy God, you sent your Son to be our physician and remedy. Strengthen medical professionals and counselors to care for the sick and grieving, especially Otto, Craig, Hilda, Helen, Joseph, Jeanne, Irma, Christa, Mary, Belle, Minerva, Jean, Angele, Joyce, Elizabeth, Raymond, Virginia and Christian, so that all people experience healing and consolation. Lord, in your mercy,

All: hear our prayer.

Assistant: Holy God, you gather us together in community, blessing us with friends and family. Make yourself known to all who celebrate special milestones, especially the birthdays of Mark, Robert, Anthony, Harrison, Collin, Maximmus, Jaye and Diane and wedding anniversaries of Melissa & Owen, Marita & Fred, Larissa & Harold and Rosa & George. Lord, in your mercy,

All: hear our prayer.

Assistant: Holy God, you show your love and faithfulness in every generation. Through the witness of our ancestors in the faith, you have shown us how to testify to your grace and truth. Lord, in your mercy,

who took on our nature and form to redeem the whole world, Jesus

Christ, our Savior and Lord.

All: Amen.

The people may greet one another with a sign of Christ's peace, and may say, "Peace be with you," or similar words.

The assembly is seated.

MEAL - God feeds us with the presence of Jesus Christ.


OFFERING

PREFACE


Presider: It is indeed right, our duty and our joy, that we should at all times and in

INVITATION TO COMMUNION


Presider: Joy to the world! The Lord is come. Let every heart receive your Savior.

The assembly is seated. The bread may be broken for the communion.

COMMUNION

We welcome all baptized believers, regardless of faith tradition, to celebrate Holy Communion at the Lord's Table. Ushers will help guide all for the distribution of Holy Communion. Unless instructed otherwise, worshipers will approach the altar from the center aisle and, if able, kneel at the Altar Rail. The presiding minister will distribute the consecrated bread, or hosts. Assisting ministers will offer individual cups of consecrated red wine and white grape juice. Should anyone have dietary concerns, gluten-free consecrated hosts are readily available upon request to the presiding minister. If you do not wish to receive Holy Communion, you are still invited to come to the Lord's Table to receive a blessing; kindly cross your arms as a method to advise the presiding minister of your desire to be blessed. When giving the bread and cup, the communion ministers say, "The body of Christ, given for you," and "The blood of Christ, shed for you," and each person may respond "Amen." Following receipt of Holy Communion, the acolyte will collect the empty cups, and the communed worshipers are invited to return to their places via the side aisles.






