INTRODUCTION



For all this we have returned to offer thanks. From this place we are sent on our way rejoicing to share the good news.

Lord, lis-ten to your chil-dren pray-ing, send us love, send us pow'r, send us grace.

The assembly stands.

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

All may make the sign of the cross, the sign marked at baptism, as the presiding minister begins.

- *Presider:* Blessed be the holy Trinity, + one God, the strength of our ancestors, the host of this meal, the builder of the city that is to come.
- All: Amen.
- *Presider:* If we have died with Christ, we will also live with Christ. Let us confess our sin to the one who is faithful.

Silence is kept for reflection.

- Presider: God our helper,
- All: we confess the many ways we have failed to live as your disciples. We have not finished what we began. We have feasted with friends but ignored strangers. We have been captivated by our possessions. Lift our burdens, gracious God. Refresh our hearts and forgive our sin. Raise us to the new life you have chosen for us in Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Amen.

All: Amen.

GATHERING SONG: *Praise to the Lord, the Almighty* (ELW Hymn 858)

GREETING

- *Presider:* The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.
- All: And also with you.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

Presider: Let us pray.

Almighty and most merciful God, your bountiful goodness fills all creation. Keep us safe from all that may hurt us, that, whole and well in body and spirit, we may with grateful hearts accomplish all that you would have us do, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.

The assembly is seated.

WORD - God speaks to us in scripture reading, preaching, and song.



FIRST READING: 2 Kings 5:1-3, 7-15c

Naaman, a Syrian general, suffers from leprosy. In this passage Elisha miraculously cures his illness, but only after Naaman realizes, with the help of his servants, that he also needs healing for his pride. This foreign general then acknowledges the sovereignty of the God of Israel.

Lector: A reading from the Book of Second Kings:

Lector: ¹Naaman, commander of the army of the king of Aram, was a great man and in high favor with his master, because by him the LORD had given victory to Aram. The man, though a mighty warrior, suffered from leprosy. ²Now the Arameans on one of their raids had taken a young girl captive from the land of Israel, and she served Naaman's wife. ³She said to her mistress, "If only my lord were with the prophet who is in Samaria! He would cure him of his leprosy." ⁷When the king of Israel read the letter, he tore his clothes and said, "Am I God, to give death or life, that this man sends word to me to cure a man of his leprosy? Just look and see how he is trying to pick a quarrel with me."

> ⁸But when Elisha the man of God heard that the king of Israel had torn his clothes, he sent a message to the king, "Why have you torn your clothes? Let him come to me, that he may learn that there is a prophet in Israel." 9So Naaman came with his horses and chariots, and halted at the entrance of Elisha's house. ¹⁰Elisha sent a messenger to him, saying, "Go, wash in the Jordan seven times, and your flesh shall be restored and you shall be clean." ¹¹But Naaman became angry and went away, saying, "I thought that for me he would surely come out, and stand and call on the name of the LORD his God, and would wave his hand over the spot, and cure the leprosy! ¹²Are not Abana and Pharpar, the rivers of Damascus, better than all the waters of Israel? Could I not wash in them, and be clean?" He turned and went away in a rage. ¹³But his servants approached and said to him, "Father, if the prophet had commanded you to do something difficult, would you not have done it? How much more, when all he said to you was, 'Wash, and be clean'?" ¹⁴So he went down and immersed himself seven times in the Jordan, according to the word of the man of God; his flesh was restored like the flesh of a young boy, and he was clean.

^{15a-c}Then he returned to the man of God, he and all his company; he came and stood before him and said, "Now I know that there is no God in all the earth except in Israel."

Lector: The word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.



GOSPEL: Luke 17:11-19

Jesus' mission includes making the unclean clean again. Unexpectedly, a cleansed Samaritan leper becomes a model for those who would praise and worship God and give thanks for God's mercy.

Presider: The holy gospel according to Saint Luke:

All: Glory to you, O Lord.

Presider: ¹¹On the way to Jerusalem Jesus was going through the region between Samaria and Galilee. ¹²As he entered a village, ten lepers approached him. Keeping their distance, ¹³they called out, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!" ¹⁴When he saw them, he said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were made clean. ¹⁵Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice. ¹⁶He prostrated himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him. And he was a Samaritan.
¹⁷Then Jesus asked, "Were not ten made clean? But the other nine, where are they? ¹⁸Was none of them found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" ¹⁹Then he said to him, "Get up and go on your way; your faith has made you well."

Presider:The gospel of the Lord.All:Praise to you, O Christ.

The assembly is seated.

PRESENTATION FOR BAPTISM

The candidate for baptism, sponsors, and parents gather with the ministers at the font.

The presiding minister may address the assembly in these or similar words:

Presider: God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism. By water and the Word God delivers us from sin and death and raises us to new life in Jesus Christ. We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and joined in God's mission for the life of the world.

The sponsors present the candidate:

Sponsors: I present Georgie Abigail Carstens Mendez for baptism.

The presiding minister addresses the parents:

- *Presider:* Called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to have your child baptized into Christ?
- Parents: I do.

Presider: As you bring Georgie Abigail Carstens Mendez to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with responsibilities:

to live with her among God's faithful people, bring her to the word of God and the holy supper, teach her the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments, place in her hands the holy scriptures, and nurture her in faith and prayer, so that your child may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace.

Presider: Do you promise to help Georgie grow in the Christian faith and life?*Parents:* I do.

The presiding minister addresses the sponsors:

Presider: Sponsors, do you promise to nurture Georgie in the Christian faith as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help her live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church?

Sponsors: I do.

The presiding minister addresses the assembly:

- *Presider:* People of God, do you promise to support Georgie and pray for her in her new life in Christ?
- All: We do.

The assembly stands.



PROFESSION OF FAITH

The presiding minister addresses the parents and sponsors of the child. The assembly may join in the responses.

- *Presider:* I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church.
- *Presider:* Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God?*Party:* I renounce them.
- *Presider:* Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God?*Party:* I renounce them.

Presider: Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God?*Party:* I renounce them.

The presiding minister addresses the baptismal party and the assembly.

Presider: Do you believe in God the Father? I believe in God, the Father almighty, All: creator of heaven and earth. *Presider:* Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God? All: I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead. Presider: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit? All: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins,

the resurrection of the body,

and the life everlasting.



THANKSGIVING AT THE FONT

Water may be poured into the font before or during the thanksgiving. At the font, the presiding minister begins the thanksgiving:

Presider: The Lord be with you.

All: And also with you.

- Presider: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
- All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.
- *Presider:* We give you thanks, O God, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and by your Word you created the world, calling forth life in which you took delight. Through the waters of the flood you delivered Noah and his family, and through the sea you led your people Israel from slavery into freedom. At the river your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit. By the baptism of Jesus' death and resurrection you set us free from the power of sin and death and raise us up to live in you.
- *Presider:* Pour out your Holy Spirit, the power of your living Word, that those who are washed in the waters of baptism may be given new life. To you be given honor and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

All: Amen.

The assembly may be seated.



BAPTISM

The presiding minister baptizes the candidate. Water is poured on the candidate's head, as the presiding minister says:

Presider: Georgie Abigail Carstens Mendez is baptized in the name of the Father,

Water is poured on the candidate's head a second time:

Presider: and of the Son,

Water is poured on the candidate's head a third time:

Presider: and of the Holy Spirit.

All: Amen.

Presider You belong to Christ, in whom you have been baptized.*All:* Alleluia.

The presiding minister continues:

Presider: Let us pray. We give you thanks, O God that through water and the Holy Spirit you give your daughters and sons new birth, cleanse them from sin, and raise them to eternal life.

Laying both hands on the head of the newly baptized, the minister prays:

- *Presider:* Sustain Georgie with the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever.
- All: Amen.

The presiding minister marks the sign of the cross on the forehead of the baptized. Oil prepared for this purpose may be used. As the sign of the cross is made, the minister says:

- *Presider:* Georgie, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.
- All: Amen.



WELCOME

A lighted candle may be given to a sponsor of the newly baptized as a representative of the congregation says:

Assistant: Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.

The ministers and the baptismal group face the assembly and <u>the assembly</u> <u>stands</u>. A representative of the congregation leads the assembly in the welcome.

Assistant: Let us welcome the newly baptized.

All: We welcome you into the body of Christ and into the mission we share: join us in giving thanks and praise to God and bearing God's creative and redeeming word to all the world.

PRAYERS OF INTERCESSION

Assistant: Knowing the one in whom we trust, and with the help of the Holy Spirit living in us, we offer our prayers for the church, the world, and all in need.

A brief silence.

Assistant: O God, you promise your church: if we die with you, we will also live with you; if we endure, we will also reign with you; even when we are faithless, you remain faithful. Strengthen us to believe your gracious promises. Lord, in your mercy,

All: hear our prayer.

Assistant: Great are your works, O Lord, and we delight in the wonder and majesty of creation. You renew us through the water and Word of Holy Baptism. Bless and care for the newly baptized, especially, Georgie. Fill all parents, especially Elmer and Pamela, and sponsors, especially Andrew, Christine and Kimberly with your Holy Spirit, so that they may be models of the Christian life. Lord, in your mercy,

All: hear our prayer.

Assistant: You wash us and we are made clean. In your compassion, immerse all who are sick and suffering in your care, especially Otto, Craig, Hilda, Helen, Joseph, Jeanne, Irma, Christa, Belle, Jean, Angele, Joyce, Elizabeth, Raymond, Virginia, Christian, Karen and Owen. Heal us, even when there may be no cure, and give us thankful hearts. Lord, in your mercy,

All: hear our prayer.

- Assistant: You called a people to be your own and yet you have shown limitless love and mercy to people of every nation. Open our hearts so that, like you, we welcome the stranger in our midst. Lord, in your mercy,
- All: hear our prayer.

Assistant: You are the source of all joy. Bless those celebrating special milestones of life, especially the birthdays of Amy, Michael, John, Sharon and Laurie and wedding anniversary of Donna and Al. Lord, in your mercy,

All: hear our prayer.

- Assistant: With love and thanksgiving, we remember those who have died in you, especially Sheila. Give us certainty to trust the salvation that is in Christ Jesus. Lord, in your mercy,
- All: hear our prayer.
- *Presider:* Trusting and delighting in you, we commend all our lives into your loving hands. We offer these prayers in the name of Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.

All: Amen.



PEACE

Presider:The peace of Christ be with you always.All:And also with you.

The people may greet one another with a sign of Christ's peace, and may say, "Peace be with you," or similar words.

The assembly is seated.

MEAL - God feeds us with the presence of Jesus Christ.


OFFERING

Assistant: Let us pray.

God our provider, we bring nothing into this world and we can take nothing out of it. Accept the gifts you have first given us, which we bring to your table, and with them the offering of our lives. Nourish us now with the life that really is life, revealed to us in Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.

All: Amen.



DIALOGUE

The presiding minister greets the assembly and invites all present to give thanks.

- *Presider:* The Lord be with you.
- All: And also with you.
- *Presider:* Lift up your hearts.
- All: We lift them to the Lord.
- *Presider:* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
- All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

PREFACE

Presider: It is indeed right, our duty and our joy, that we should at all times and in all places give thanks and praise to you, almighty and merciful God, through our Savior Jesus Christ; who on this day overcame death and the grave, and by his glorious resurrection opened to us the way of everlasting life. And so, with all the choirs of angels, with the church on earth and the hosts of heaven, we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

LORD'S PRAYER


Presider: Lord, remember us in your kingdom, and teach us to pray:

Presider: Jesus welcomes sinners and eats with them. Come, take your place at the feast.


The assembly is seated. The bread may be broken for the communion.



COMMUNION

We welcome all baptized believers, regardless of faith tradition, to celebrate Holy Communion at the Lord's Table. Ushers will help guide all for the distribution of Holy Communion. Unless instructed otherwise, worshipers will approach the altar from the center aisle and, if able, kneel at the Altar Rail. The presiding minister will distribute the consecrated bread, or hosts. Assisting ministers will offer individual cups of consecrated red wine and white grape juice. Should anyone have dietary concerns, gluten-free consecrated hosts are readily available upon request to the presiding minister. If you do not wish to receive Holy Communion, you are still invited to come to the Lord's Table to receive a blessing; kindly cross your arms as a method to advise the presiding minister of your desire to be blessed. When giving the bread and cup, the communion ministers say, "The body of Christ, given for you," and "The blood of Christ, shed for you," and each person may respond "Amen." Following receipt of Holy Communion, the acolyte will collect the empty cups, and the communed worshipers are invited to return to their places via the side aisles.


