

WELCOME to the CHURCH OF OUR SAVIOUR, LUTHERAN (COSL)! We are pleased to have you join us for worship today, and we hope that your experience is spiritually enriching and meaningful.

IF YOU ARE NEW to COSL, here are some things you might like to know:

- Who we are. COSL is a congregation of the family of God that welcomes all people without discrimination or prejudice, seeking to strengthen one another with Word and Sacraments, prayer and example. Our mission is to:
 - Share the Gospel of Jesus Christ and his love with all people.
 - Reach out to our community with friendship and witness.
 - Bring hope and healing to those who are in need, both at home and abroad.
 - Offer opportunities for worship, learning, fellowship and service.
 - Encourage all members to discover, develop and share their God-given talents.
- Children are always welcome to join us for worship. They are encouraged to come forward during Children's Messages and participate. Also, please note that there are Activity Bags (containing books, coloring and other materials inside) available for children preschool to Age 6, in the narthex (entrance hall).
- **Childcare** is provided for interested families during worship. Ms. Anna Gordy, a mother of four and grandmother of nine (and counting!), has vast experience in child care, including 15 years at a local Parish Resource Center. This ministry is provided in the Nursery School Room, located on the lower level.
- **Sunday School** is available for children ages 4 through 12, is offered September through June. The program begins during the 10AM worship with an opening Children's Message among the entire congregation, and then the students depart to learn beloved Bible stories, Lutheran identity and the love of Jesus. They return before the conclusion of worship to participate in the dismissal. On designated Youth Sundays the students may remain with the entire congregation and participate in a meaningful way throughout the liturgy.
- Coffee and refreshments are generally served following worship in the Parlor, located on the lower level accessible from the narthex (entrance hall). Please join us!
- **Restrooms** are located on the lower level along the main hallway. A changing table is available in another restroom located off of the fellowship hall.
- Worship Assistance and Emergency Needs. First aid kits and a defibrillator are readily available. Please see an usher if assistance is needed, or if you have any other concerns or questions.

GATHERING - The Holy Spirit calls us together as the people of God.

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

All may make the sign of the cross, the sign marked at baptism, as the presiding minister begins.

Presider: Blessed be the holy Trinity, + one God, who forgives all our sin, whose

mercy endures forever.

All: Amen.

Presider: Seeking reconciliation with God and neighbor, let us remember the gift

of baptism and confess our sin.

Silence is kept for reflection.

Presider: God of mercy,

All: We confess that we have sinned against you, against one another,

and against the earth entrusted to our care. We are worried and distracted by many things, and we fail to love you above all else.

We store up treasures for ourselves and turn away from our

neighbors in need. Forgive us, that we may live in the freedom of

your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen.

Presider: When we were laid low by sin and guilt, God made us alive together

with Christ, forgiving us + all our trespasses by taking our sins to the cross. For freedom Christ has set us free: Rejoice in this good news!

All: Amen.

GATHERING SONG: God of Grace and God of Glory (ELW Hymn 705)

GREETING

Presider: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the

communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

All: And also with you.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

Presider: Let us pray.

O God our Father, at the baptism of Jesus you proclaimed him your beloved Son and anointed him with the Holy Spirit. Make all who are baptized into Christ faithful to their calling to be your daughters and sons, and empower us all with your Spirit, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one

God, now and forever.

All: Amen.

The assembly is seated.

WORD - God speaks to us in scripture reading, preaching, and song.

LESSON: Acts 2:14a, 36-41

Today's reading is the conclusion of Peter's sermon preached following the giving of the Holy Spirit to the apostles on the day of Pentecost. The center of his preaching is the bold declaration that God has made the crucified Jesus both Lord and Christ.

Lector: A reading from the Acts of the Apostles:

Lector:

^{14a}Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed [the crowd], ³⁶"Therefore let the entire house of Israel know with certainty that God has made him both Lord and Messiah, this Jesus whom you crucified."

³⁷Now when they heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and to the other apostles, "Brothers, what should we do?" ³⁸Peter said to them, "Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ so that your sins may be forgiven; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. ³⁹For the promise is for you, for your children, and for all who are far away, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to him." ⁴⁰And he testified with many other arguments and exhorted them, saying, "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation." ⁴¹So those who welcomed his message were baptized, and that day about three thousand persons were added.

Lector: The word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.

SERMON

The assembly stands.

HYMN OF THE DAY: We Are Baptized in Christ Jesus (ELW Hymn 451)



The assembly is seated.

PRESENTATION FOR BAPTISM

The candidate for baptism, sponsors, and parents gather with the ministers at the font.

The presiding minister may address the assembly in these or similar words:

Presider: God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism. By water and the Word God delivers us from sin and death and raises us to new life in Jesus Christ. We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and joined in God's mission for the life of the world.

The sponsors present the candidate:

Sponsors: I present Ellis Grace McNally for baptism.

The presiding minister addresses the parents:

Presider: Called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you

desire to have your child baptized into Christ?

Parents: I do.

Presider: As you bring Ellis Grace McNally to receive the gift of baptism, you are

entrusted with responsibilities:

to live with her among God's faithful people,

bring her to the word of God and the holy supper, teach her the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten

Commandments,

place in her hands the holy scriptures,

and nurture her in faith and prayer,

so that your child may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed,

care for others and the world God made.

and work for justice and peace.

Presider: Do you promise to help Ellis grow in the Christian faith and life?

Parents: I do.

The presiding minister addresses the sponsors:

Presider: Sponsors, do you promise to nurture Ellis in the Christian faith as you

are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help her live in the covenant of

baptism and in communion with the church?

Sponsors: I do.

The presiding minister addresses the assembly:

Presider: People of God, do you promise to support Ellis and pray for her in his

new life in Christ?

All: We do.

The assembly stands.



PROFESSION OF FAITH

The presiding minister addresses the parents and sponsors of the child. The assembly may join in the responses.

Presider: I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess

the faith of the church.

Presider: Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God?

Party: I renounce them.

Presider: Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God?

Party: I renounce them.

Presider: Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God?

Party: I renounce them.

The presiding minister addresses the baptismal party and the assembly.

Presider: Do you believe in God the Father?

All: I believe in God, the Father almighty,

creator of heaven and earth.

Presider: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

All: I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord,

who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,

born of the virgin Mary,

suffered under Pontius Pilate,

was crucified, died, and was buried;

he descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again;

he ascended into heaven,

he is seated at the right hand of the Father,

and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Presider: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

All: I believe in the Holy Spirit,

the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins,

the resurrection of the body,

and the life everlasting.



THANKSGIVING AT THE FONT

Water may be poured into the font before or during the thanksgiving. At the font, the presiding minister begins the thanksgiving:

Presider: The Lord be with you.

All: And also with you.

Presider: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Presider: We give you thanks, O God, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over

the waters and by your Word you created the world, calling forth life in which you took delight. Through the waters of the flood you delivered Noah and his family, and through the sea you led your people Israel from slavery into freedom. At the river your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit. By the baptism of Jesus' death and resurrection you set us free from the power of sin and death and raise

us up to live in you.

Presider: Pour out your Holy Spirit, the power of your living Word, that those who

are washed in the waters of baptism may be given new life. To you be given honor and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of

the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

All: Amen.

The assembly may be seated.

BAPTISM

The presiding minister baptizes the candidate. Water is poured on the candidate's head, as the presiding minister says:

Presider: Ellis Grace McNally is baptized in the name of the Father,

Water is poured on the candidate's head a second time:

Presider: and of the Son,

Water is poured on the candidate's head a third time:

Presider: and of the Holy Spirit.

All: Amen.

Presider You belong to Christ, in whom you have been baptized.

All: Alleluia.

The presiding minister continues:

Presider: Let us pray.

We give you thanks, O God that through water and the Holy Spirit you give your daughters and sons new birth, cleanse them from sin, and

raise them to eternal life.

Laying both hands on the head of the newly baptized, the minister prays:

Presider: Sustain Ellis with the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and

understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and

forever.

All: Amen.

The presiding minister marks the sign of the cross on the forehead of the baptized. Oil prepared for this purpose may be used. As the sign of the cross is made, the minister says:

Presider: Ellis, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked

with the cross of Christ forever.

All: Amen.



WELCOME

A lighted candle may be given to a sponsor of the newly baptized as a representative of the congregation says:

Assistant: Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.

The ministers and the baptismal group face the assembly and the assembly stands. A representative of the congregation leads the assembly in the welcome.

Assistant: Let us welcome the newly baptized.

All: We welcome you into the body of Christ and into the mission we share: join us in giving thanks and praise to God and bearing God's creative and redeeming word to all the world.

PRAYERS OF INTERCESSION

Assistant: Treasuring your promise to hear us when we call, we pray for the church, those in need, and all of your creation.

A brief silence.

Assistant: Lord God, bless and send your church out from each place of worship to be a light to the nations. Wherever we set out in faith, equip us to share our hope in Jesus Christ. Lord, in your mercy,

All: hear our prayer.

Assistant: Bless and care for the newly baptized, especially, Ellis. Fill all parents, including John and Eileen, and sponsors, including Jeannie, Tyler and Laura, with your Holy Spirit, so that they may be models of the Christian life. Lord, in your mercy,

All: hear our prayer.

Assistant: Bless and govern the nations, uniting all humankind in seeking justice and peace. Fashion our hearts and guide our deeds in love. Lord, in your mercy,

All: hear our prayer.

Assistant: Bless and comfort those in need, providing shelter to those without homes, food for those who hunger, companionship to those who are lonely, and health to the sick, especially Otto, Craig, Hilda, Helen, Joseph, Jeanne, Irma, Christa, Mary, Belle, Minerva, Jean, Angele, Joyce, Elizabeth, Raymond, Klaus, Virginia, Bruce, Christian and Bruce. Be their help and their shield. Lord, in your mercy,

All: hear our prayer.

Assistant: Bless and rejoice with those celebrating special occasions in life,

especially the birthdays of Andy, Elizabeth, Timothy, Tom and Connor

and wedding anniversary of Pam and Andrew. Lord, in your mercy,

All: hear our prayer.

Assistant: Keep in your care the faithful loved ones who have died in Christ,

especially Richard, until we join them in the everlasting city, whose

architect and builder is God. Lord, in your mercy,

All: hear our prayer.

Presider: All these things and more we ask in the name of our risen Lord, Jesus

Christ, by the power of your Holy Spirit.

All: Amen.



PEACE

The peace of Christ be with you always. Presider:

All: And also with you.

The people may greet one another with a sign of Christ's peace, and may say, "Peace be with you," or similar words.

The assembly is seated.

MEAL - God feeds us with the presence of Jesus Christ.


OFFERING

After the table is set, the assisting minister leads the following prayer.

Assistant: Let us pray.

Blessed are you, O God, for the greening earth given for all, for the talents we are given to share, and for this bread and wine. Transform us to be the body of Christ, that, feasting on this food and drink, our

lives may reflect your generosity; through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.



DIALOGUE

The presiding minister greets the assembly and invites all present to give thanks.

Presider: The Lord be with you.

All: And also with you.

Presider: Lift up your hearts.

All: We lift them to the Lord.

Presider: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.


PREFACE

LORD'S PRAYER


Presider: Lord, remember us in your kingdom, and teach us to pray:

INVITATION TO COMMUNION


Presider: God invites you to this table of bounty. Come, the banquet is ready.

The assembly is seated. The bread may be broken for the communion.

COMMUNION

We welcome all baptized believers, regardless of faith tradition, to celebrate Holy Communion at the Lord's Table. Ushers will help guide all for the distribution of Holy Communion. Unless instructed otherwise, worshipers will approach the altar from the center aisle and, if able, kneel at the Altar Rail. The presiding minister will distribute the consecrated bread, or hosts. Assisting ministers will offer individual cups of consecrated red wine and white grape juice. Should anyone have dietary concerns, gluten-free consecrated hosts are readily available upon request to the presiding minister. If you do not wish to receive Holy Communion, you are still invited to come to the Lord's Table to receive a blessing; kindly cross your arms as a method to advise the presiding minister of your desire to be blessed. When giving the bread and cup, the communion ministers say, "The body of Christ, given for you," and "The blood of Christ, shed for you," and each person may respond "Amen." Following receipt of Holy Communion, the acolyte will collect the empty cups, and the communed worshipers are invited to return to their places via the side aisles.


