WELCOME to the CHURCH OF OUR SAVIOUR, LUTHERAN (COSL)! We are pleased to have you join us for worship today, and we hope that your experience is spiritually enriching and meaningful.

IF YOU ARE NEW to COSL, here are some things you might like to know:

- **Who we are.** COSL is a congregation of the family of God that welcomes all people without discrimination or prejudice, seeking to strengthen one another with Word and Sacraments, prayer and example. Our mission is to:
  - Share the Gospel of Jesus Christ and his love with all people.
  - Reach out to our community with friendship and witness.

This ministry is provided in the Nursery School Room, located on the lower level.
- **Sunday School** is available for children ages 4 through 12, is offered September through June. The program begins during the 10AM worship with an opening Children's Message among the entire congregation, and then the students depart to learn beloved Bible stories, Lutheran identity and the love of Jesus. They return before the conclusion of worship to participate in the dismissal. On designated Youth Sundays the students may remain with the entire congregation and participate in a meaningful way throughout the liturgy.
- **Coffee and refreshments** are generally served following worship in the Parlor, located on the lower level accessible from the narthex (entrance hall). Please join us!
- **Restrooms** are located on the lower level along the main hallway. A changing table is available in another restroom located off of the fellowship hall.

## ASCENSION OF OUR LORD



### **LESSON: Acts 1:1-11**

*Before he is lifted into heaven, Jesus promises that the missionary work of the disciples will spread out from Jerusalem to all the world. His words provide an outline of the book of Acts.*

*Presider:* A reading from the Acts of the Apostles:

*Presider:* [Luke writes:] <sup>1</sup>In the first book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus did and taught from the beginning <sup>2</sup>until the day when he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. <sup>3</sup>After his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. <sup>4</sup>While staying with them, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father. "This," he said, "is what you have heard from me; <sup>5</sup>for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now."



<sup>6</sup>So when they had come together, they asked him, “Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?” <sup>7</sup>He replied, “It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. <sup>8</sup>But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.” <sup>9</sup>When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight.

*The Paschal Candle is extinguished and moved from the altar to the Baptismal Font.*

<sup>10</sup>While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. <sup>11</sup>They said, “Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven.”

*Presider:* The word of the Lord.

*All:* **Thanks be to God.**





Make us love what you command and desire what you promise, that, amid all the changes of this world, our hearts may be fixed where true joy is found, your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

**WORD** - God speaks to us in scripture reading, preaching, and song.

**FIRST READING: Acts 16:16-34**

*The owners of a slave-girl who used her powers to tell fortunes threw Paul and Silas into jail for “healing” her and, consequently, ruining their business. In prison, Paul and Silas bring the good news of the gospel to the jailer and his family.*

*Lector:* A reading from the Acts of the Apostles:

*Lector:* <sup>16</sup>One day, as we were going to the place of prayer, we met a slave-girl who had a spirit of divination and brought her owners a great deal of money by fortune-telling. <sup>17</sup>While she followed Paul and us, she would cry out, “These men are slaves of the Most High God, who proclaim to you a way of salvation.” <sup>18</sup>She kept doing this for many days. But Paul, very much annoyed, turned and said to the spirit, “I order you in the name of Jesus Christ to come out of her.” And it came out that very hour.

<sup>19</sup>But when her owners saw that their hope of making money was gone, they seized Paul and Silas and dragged them into the marketplace before the authorities. <sup>20</sup>When they had brought them before the magistrates, they said, “These men are disturbing our city;

they are Jews <sup>21</sup>and are advocating customs that are not lawful for us as Romans to adopt or observe.” <sup>22</sup>The crowd joined in attacking them, and the magistrates had them stripped of their clothing and ordered them to be beaten with rods. <sup>23</sup>After they had given them a severe flogging, they threw them into prison and ordered the jailer to keep them securely. <sup>24</sup>Following these instructions, he put them in the innermost cell and fastened their feet in the stocks.

<sup>25</sup>About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them. <sup>26</sup>Suddenly there was an earthquake, so violent that the foundations of the prison were shaken; and immediately all the doors were opened and everyone’s chains were unfastened. <sup>27</sup>When the jailer woke up and saw the prison doors wide open, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself, since he supposed that the prisoners had escaped. <sup>28</sup>But Paul shouted in a loud voice, “Do not harm yourself, for we are all here.” <sup>29</sup>The jailer called for lights, and rushing in, he fell down trembling before Paul and Silas. <sup>30</sup>Then he brought them outside and said, “Sirs, what must I do to be saved?” <sup>31</sup>They answered, “Believe on the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household.” <sup>32</sup>They spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all who were in his house. <sup>33</sup>At the same hour of the night he took them and washed their wounds; then he and his entire family were baptized without delay. <sup>34</sup>He brought them up into the house and set food before them; and he and his entire household rejoiced that he had become a believer in God.

*Lector:* The word of the Lord.

*All:* **Thanks be to God.**

## **PSALM: Psalm 97**

*Assistant:* The Psalm is spoken responsively.

*Assistant:* <sup>1</sup>The LORD reigns; let the earth rejoice;  
let the multitude of the isles be glad.

*All:* <sup>2</sup>**Clouds and darkness surround the LORD,  
righteousness and justice  
are the foundations of God's throne.**

*Assistant:* <sup>3</sup>Fire goes before the LORD,  
burning up enemies on every side.

*All:* <sup>4</sup>**Lightnings light up the world;  
the earth sees and trembles.**

before the Lord of all the earth.

*Assistant:* <sup>9</sup>For you are the LORD, most high over all the earth;  
you are exalted far above all gods.

*All:* <sup>10</sup>**You who love the LORD, hate evil!  
God guards the lives of the saints  
and rescues them from the hand of the wicked.**

*Assistant:* <sup>11</sup>Light dawns for the righteous,  
and joy for the honest of heart.

*All:* <sup>12</sup>**Rejoice in the LORD, you righteous,  
and give thanks to God's holy name.**

## **SECOND READING: Revelation 22:12-14, 16-17, 20-21**

*The ascended Christ, hidden from our sight, promises to come again. We eagerly pray, "Come, Lord Jesus," with all who respond to this invitation.*

*Lector:* A reading from the Revelation to Saint John:

*Lector:* <sup>12</sup>"See, I am coming soon; my reward is with me, to repay according to everyone's work. <sup>13</sup>I am the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end."

<sup>14</sup>Blessed are those who wash their robes, so that they will have the right to the tree of life and may enter the city by the gates.

<sup>16</sup>"It is I, Jesus, who sent my angel to you with this testimony for the churches. I am the root and the descendant of David, the bright morning star."

<sup>17</sup>The Spirit and the bride say, "Come."

And let everyone who hears say, "Come."

And let everyone who is thirsty come.

Let anyone who wishes take the water of life as a gift.

<sup>20</sup>The one who testifies to these things says, "Surely I am coming soon."



## GOSPEL: *John 17:20-26*

*Jesus prays that the life of his followers will be characterized by an intimate unity of identity with God. To be so identified with God means also to share in God's mission: to proclaim the word that will bring others into this same unity.*

*Presider:* The holy gospel according to Saint John:

*All:* **Glory to you, O Lord.**

*Presider:* [Jesus prayed:] <sup>20</sup>"I ask not only on behalf of these, but also on behalf of those who will believe in me through their word, <sup>21</sup>that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me. <sup>22</sup>The glory that you have given me I have given them, so that they may be one, as we are one, <sup>23</sup>I in them and you in me, that they may become completely one, so that the world may know that you have sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me. <sup>24</sup>Father, I desire that those also, whom you have given me, may be with me where I am, to see my glory, which you have given me because you loved me before the foundation of the world.

<sup>25</sup>"Righteous Father, the world does not know you, but I know you; and these know that you have sent me. <sup>26</sup>I made your name known to them, and I will make it known, so that the love with which you have loved me may be in them, and I in them."

*Presider:* The gospel of the Lord.  
*All:* **Praise to you, O Christ.**

*The assembly is seated.*

## **PRESENTATION FOR BAPTISM**

*The candidate for baptism, sponsors, and parents gather with the ministers at the font.*

*The presiding minister may address the assembly in these or similar words:*

*Presider:* God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism. By water and the Word God delivers us from sin and death and raises us to new life in Jesus Christ. We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and joined in God's mission for the life of the world.

*The sponsors present the candidate:*

*Sponsors:* I present Amelia Grace Lo Russo for baptism.

*The presiding minister addresses the parents:*

*Presider:* Called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to have your child baptized into Christ?

*Parents:* I do.

*Presider:* As you bring Amelia Grace Lo Russo to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with responsibilities:

to live with her among God's faithful people,  
bring her to the word of God and the holy supper,  
teach her the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten  
Commandments,  
place in her hands the holy scriptures,  
and nurture her in faith and prayer,  
so that your child may learn to trust God,  
proclaim Christ through word and deed,  
care for others and the world God made,  
and work for justice and peace.

*Presider:* Do you promise to help Amelia grow in the Christian faith and life?

*Parents:* I do.

*The presiding minister addresses the sponsors:*

*Presider:* Sponsors, do you promise to nurture Amelia in the Christian faith as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help her live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church?

*Sponsors:* I do.

*The presiding minister addresses the assembly:*

*Presider:* People of God, do you promise to support Amelia and pray for her in his new life in Christ?

*All:* **We do.**

*The assembly stands.*



## PROFESSION OF FAITH

*The presiding minister addresses the parents and sponsors of the child. The assembly may join in the responses.*

*Presider:* I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church.

*Presider:* Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God?

*Party:* I renounce them.

*Presider:* Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God?

*Party:* I renounce them.

*Presider:* Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God?

*Party:* I renounce them.

*The presiding minister addresses the baptismal party and the assembly.*

*Presider:* Do you believe in God the Father?

*All:* **I believe in God, the Father almighty,  
creator of heaven and earth.**

*Presider:* Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

*All:* **I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord,  
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,  
born of the virgin Mary,  
suffered under Pontius Pilate,  
was crucified, died, and was buried;  
he descended to the dead.  
On the third day he rose again;  
he ascended into heaven,  
he is seated at the right hand of the Father,  
and he will come to judge the living and the dead.**

*Presider:* Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

*All:* **I believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the holy catholic church,  
the communion of saints,  
the forgiveness of sins,  
the resurrection of the body,  
and the life everlasting.**

## **THANKSGIVING AT THE FONT**

*Water may be poured into the font before or during the thanksgiving. At the font, the presiding minister begins the thanksgiving:*

*Presider:* The Lord be with you.

*All:* **And also with you.**

*Presider:* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.


*All:* **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

*Presider:* We give you thanks, O God, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and by your Word you created the world, calling forth life in which you took delight. Through the waters of the flood you delivered Noah and his family, and through the sea you led your people Israel from slavery into freedom. At the river your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit. By the baptism of Jesus' death and resurrection you set us free from the power of sin and death and raise us up to live in you.

*Presider:* Pour out your Holy Spirit, the power of your living Word, that those who are washed in the waters of baptism may be given new life. To you be given honor and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

*All:* **Amen.**

*The assembly may be seated.*



## BAPTISM

*The presiding minister baptizes the candidate. Water is poured on the candidate's head, as the presiding minister says:*

*Presider:* Amelia Grace LoRusso is baptized in the name of the Father,

*Water is poured on the candidate's head a second time:*

*Presider:* and of the Son,

*Water is poured on the candidate's head a third time:*

*Presider:* and of the Holy Spirit.

*All:* **Amen.**

*Presider:* You belong to Christ, in whom you have been baptized.

*All:* **Alleluia.**

*The presiding minister continues:*

*Presider:* Let us pray.

We give you thanks, O God that through water and the Holy Spirit you give your daughters and sons new birth, cleanse them from sin, and raise them to eternal life.

*Laying both hands on the head of the newly baptized, the minister prays:*

*Presider:* Sustain Amelia with the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever.

*All:* **Amen.**

*The presiding minister marks the sign of the cross on the forehead of the baptized. Oil prepared for this purpose may be used. As the sign of the cross is made, the minister says:*

*Presider:* Amelia, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.

*All:* **Amen.**



## **WELCOME**

*A lighted candle may be given to a sponsor of the newly baptized as a representative of the congregation says:*

*Assistant:* Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.

*The ministers and the baptismal group face the assembly and the assembly stands. A representative of the congregation leads the assembly in the welcome.*

*Assistant:* Let us welcome the newly baptized.

*All:* **We welcome you into the body of Christ and into the mission we share: join us in giving thanks and praise to God and bearing God's creative and redeeming word to all the world.**

## PRAYERS OF INTERCESSION

*Assistant:* Trusting God's promise of new life, we pray for the renewal of the church, the world, and all of creation.

*A brief silence.*

*Assistant:* Bless the newly baptized, especially Amelia, her parents Lauren and Leonard, her sponsors Andrew and Melissa, and all who have been blessed with the gift of the Holy Spirit. Hear us, O God.

*All:* **Your mercy is great.**

*Assistant:* Pour out over all the earth the water of life as a gift. Wash the wounds of creation and restore all living things to wholeness. Protect ocean habitats, river ecosystems, and wetlands. Hear us, O God.

*All:* **Your mercy is great.**

*Assistant:* Come quickly to the aid of your people. Give wisdom and the gift of calm to military, prison, hospital, and hospice chaplains who stand as signs of your abiding presence. Refresh all who thirst for love, hope, or healing, especially Otto, Hilda, Helen, Joseph, Jeanne, Irma, Christa, Mary, Belle, Minerva, Jean, Angele, Joyce, Craig, Raymond, Lynn, Christian, Elizabeth, Horton and Virginia. Hear us, O God.

*All:* **Your mercy is great.**

*Assistant:* Let your word fill our hearts and our homes. Bless all who teach us the faith: pastors and deacons, Sunday school and confirmation teachers, public theologians, mentors, curriculum writers, and publishers. Hear us, O God.

*All:* **Your mercy is great.**

*Assistant:* Give a spirit of joy to all who celebrate the special milestones of life, especially the birthdays of Preben, Hans, Nancy, Nina, Lilly, Linnea, Jen and Ingrid and wedding anniversary of Claire and Preben. Hear us, O God.

*All:* **Your mercy is great.**

*Assistant:* Hold all the saints in the grace of the Lord Jesus. Sustain weary souls with the promise that the morning star is coming soon to lead us into light. Hear us, O God.

*All:* **Your mercy is great.**

*Presider:* We commend these and all our prayers to you, O God. Come near to us with your saving help, for the sake of Jesus Christ, our risen Lord.

*All:* **Amen.**



## PEACE

*Presider:* The peace of Christ be with you always.

*All:* **And also with you.**

*The people may greet one another with a sign of Christ's peace, and may say, "Peace be with you," or similar words.*

*The assembly is seated.*

## MEAL - God feeds us with the presence of Jesus Christ.

### OFFERING

*An offering is gathered for the mission of the church, including the care of those in need. During this time, the table is set. The Offertory Anthem accompanies the gathering of the offering.*

### OFFERTORY ANTHEM: *Every Time I Feel the Spirit* (Arr. William Dawson)

The assembly stands. *Bread, wine, money and other gifts may be brought forward.*

### PRESENTATION OF GIFTS and OFFERING SONG:

#### *Let the Vineyards be Fruitful* (ELW Hymn 184)

Let the vine-yards be fruit-ful, Lord, and fill to the brim our cup of  
bless-ing. Gath-er a har-vest from the seeds that were sown, that  
we may be fed with the bread of life. Gath-er the hopes and dreams of  
all; u-nite them with the prayers we of-fer. Grace our ta-ble  
with your pres-ence, and give us a fore-taste of the feast to come.

## OFFERING PRAYER

*After the table is set, the assisting minister leads the following prayer.*

*Assistant:* Let us pray.

Risen One, as you broke bread with the disciples on the shore, meet us now in this meal. Nourish us to follow you, using our gifts to feed the hungry and tend the weary, and all for your love's sake.

*All:* **Amen.**



## DIALOGUE





## COMMUNION

Unless instructed otherwise, worshipers will approach the altar from the center aisle and, if able, kneel at the Altar Rail. The presiding minister will distribute the consecrated bread, or hosts. Assisting ministers will offer individual cups of consecrated red wine and white grape juice. Should anyone have dietary concerns, gluten-free consecrated hosts are readily available upon request to the presiding minister. If you do not wish to receive Holy Communion, you are still invited to come to the Lord's Table to receive a blessing; kindly cross your arms as a method to advise the presiding minister of your desire to be blessed. When giving the bread and cup, the communion ministers say, "The body of Christ, given for you," and "The blood of Christ, shed for you," and each person may respond "Amen." Following receipt of Holy Communion, the acolyte will collect the empty cups, and the communed worshipers are invited to return to their places via the side aisles.*




